The Watford Peace Garden

was initiated in 2013 by the Watford Interfaith Association with the endorsement of the faith communities of Watford. Half an acre in the Community Garden of Cassiobury Park was allocated for the project and a team of volunteers headed by Jeff Bateman began to work on creating the Garden. The Watford Borough Council Small Grant helped to start off the project and Borras, the building company involved in the improvement of Cassiobury Park contributed greatly to the ground work. One of the main features of the Peace Garden is its labyrinth which can be used for a meditative walk or a stage for small performances of music or poetry, with people seated on the raised banks.

Many individuals and organisations have sponsored and contributed to the creation of the Peace Garden, among them our thanks go to the Green Gym for lending us their tools and their support, to Tim and Angela Neale for donating a bench in memory of Marguerite Neale, to the Watford Bridge of Peace for donating the Bridge of Peace arch, to TESCO for sponsoring our lawn mower and to all those who donated plants and bulbs and who volunteer in many different ways.
